The youngsters from 16 to 25 will be busy either with exams, the end of the academic year or away on holiday.

The remainder of the population ó young parents and people in employment will be planning their holidays and will almost certainly be away for at least two weeks of the consultation period.

When they get back from holidays, there is the inevitable post-holiday depression, coupled with the inevitable financial fallout, together with all the harassment of getting back to work and getting the children back to school.

No time for planning scrolls

Another good choice.
